We are currently working on the implementation of a PDX driving curriculum with more classroom time and specific on track "drills" each session. Planning for the 2018 season club race is underway. We have had our first division scheduling meeting and plan to finalize the first round of race dates after the Runoffs. BoD Minutes DMVR Board Minutes September 5, 2017 Minute by Minute

The DMVR SCCA board meeting was called to order on May 2, 2017 at Smokey D's by Assistant RE Chris Reister. A total of 18 present.

The following board members were present: Harlan Donaldson Fred Bell Chris Riester Randy Sams Jerry Grogan Mary Harrington Erich Pfalzgraf (by phone)

RE Report: Erich reported by phone that DMVR has an opportunity to host a Major race with a tentative date of May 19-20, 2018. This would be the third Major race of the 2018 season which is usually well attended. With the typical higher car count seen in a Major race, reaching breakeven should not be a problem. June 2-3 would be another option. Iowa Speedway has already confirmed May 19-20 is open and they are checking on the June 2-3. Erich advised that Iowa Speedway wants to have a Majors race.

There was a discussion about getting an assurance that there would not be another Majors race on the same date or with a specified distance. Erich will get more information on this. It was discussed if we can run a PDX or a Regional with the Majors.

There was discussion about the possibility of RPM being a location for the Major race. However, the paddock is in need of repair and we would need approval from Nebraska Region.

Erich advised that there will be another conference call in 2-3 weeks. He advised he will discuss with the race committee for their feedback and he will have discussion with the board.

Erich reported that he has been working with Midiv on a Time Trials Program for the Division. He advised Randy has some great ideas for CTT/PDX. Possibly this would include tracks at Iowa Speedway, Heartland Park, and RPM. There is also work being done on a DMVR Time Trials Program with a point system. Randy is working on a point system. Erich advised registration is open for the October 8th PDX.

Solo: Randy reported there were 66 drivers at last event. The course was awesome and everyone had a good time. Jerry reported that the Iowa Speedway event had to be cancelled as the track did not have anyone to work.

Jerry reported the Iowa State group would like to host an event together on September 30th at the Iowa State parking lot which would be sanctioned. Fred suggested this may be a potential future site for Street Survival. A motion was made by Jerry to hold a solo test/tune event with Iowa State Group on September 30th. Seconded by Randy. Motion passed.

Jerry advised the October 15th event has been moved to October 22nd. Bob Mauer will chair this event. There may be another event in November as a make up event.

Assistant RE: Chris reported the banquet will be November 11th and he will have a RSVP form for the October Drifting. Mary advised the deadline for Hoskins Award nominations is September 30th. Dave Champion advised the deadline for the Scharnberg award is September 30th.

Treasurer: Fred reported we still have money.

Club Racing: Harlan reported he has not heard anything from the drivers. He advised we're loosing drivers due to the Majors. Harlan advised he had three races scheduled at the beginning of this season and all three were cancelled.

Old Business: Harlan reminded everyone of the Oct 7th Street Survival. Fred asked who is already signed up to work. We are hoping this will be a sell out at 34 students – there are 12 signed up so far. We will need 20+ volunteers. Harlan advised he has flyers.

Motion made by Randy to adjourn, Seconded by Dan Harrington.

F4 United States Championship Powered by Honda

Rounds 13 -15 VIRginia International Raceway, Aug, 25-27, 2017 By Carl Wieman, Owatonna, MN



Thirty two F4 cars took the track on a warm humid day for Practice on Friday, followed by Qualifying later in the day. The Qualifying Session was a little messy, with a few drivers causing a Red Flag. All the drivers were informed at the Drivers Meeting that a Red Flag will result in a 2 place grid penalty. That resulted in some drivers not being able to start in the spot that they thought

they were going to start in. It did give them a chance to think about those mistakes that they had made.

This first race of the weekend was the best race we had all year in F4. There was not one Yellow or Red Flag the whole 30 minute race. Just hard racing for 16 laps, with 27 cars finishing on the lead lap. The top 5 finishers were from five different countries, showing the diversity of the drivers.

These young drivers come to the USA with a Visa for racing and stay in the USA until the series has its last race in October. First place was Baltazar Leguizamon from Buenos Aires, Argentina. His mother flies to the US for every race to watch him. She told me that her son decided to come to the US to race in F4, even with 12 other countries to pick from to race in F4. They researched each series in the other countries and said the US F4 Championship, with SCCA Pro Racing to be the best place to race. This is mainly because of the professionalism of SCCA Pro Racing and the history of SCCA.

In the 2^{nd} race of the weekend, Jordan Sherratt of Durban, South Africa moved up to 1^{st} place from his 2^{nd} place finish in the previous race. This was Jordon's 1^{st} win of the year. He took the lead in the final

laps from Kyle Kirkwood, Jupiter, Florida, the current points leader. I was with Jordan in Parc ferm'e when his Dad called from South Africa to congratulate him on the win. He had been watching the live timing on Race Monitor and saw him take the win.

This was the most excited that I have seen Jordan all season. When you visit with him, whether it be for his safety inspection, line up his car on Pre-grid, or just to visit and ask him some questions, he stays calm. But, when he gets that helmet on and the green flag drops,

he has only one thing on his mind...go for the win. I wish we had an on-board camera that shows the drivers face. cards after each session, for review if needed.

The 3rd race of the weekend was on Sunday morning with a light breeze and cool for VIR, about 80F. This race was won by Kyle Kirkwood, making it his 8th win of the season in F4. This brings his total points to 251 versus 160 for 2nd place Raphael Forcier of Montreal, Canada, with only 5 races remaining in the series for the year.

Kyle has recently been selected to receive one of two Team USA Scholarships, granting him entry into his first international race at the Formula Ford Festival in Brands Hatch.

Hurricane Harvey hit on Friday of this weekend, and several drivers donated a portion of their winnings or all on it to the Red Cross or Houston Humane Society, along with matching money from the JRi Shocks and also SCCA Pro Racing.

It is great to see these young drivers, even if not from the USA, donating to help with this hurricane relief.


